





We are excited to share a few updates since our last annual report.

RIRSD Table, Negotiations and Priorities

In 2022, Tsartlip rejoined the Recognition of Indigenous Rights and Self-Determination (RIRSD) Table with the Federal government. Earlier this year, Tsartlip Chief and Council met to establish a vision and set priorities for the RIRSD table. For the 2023-2024 fiscal year, Tsartlip's priorities for the RIRSD Table include: establishing a community consultation and engagement strategy, consulting with the community and interest groups, researching historical breaches of the Douglas Treaty, researching cojurisdiction models for lands and resources, and developing an economic development strategy.

MAWUEC, the Former Woodwynn Farm

As you recall, we reported on the contamination discovered at the farm; we are pleased to announce we've secured an additional million dollars this past year from the Province to execute a remediation plan at the property. Next, we meet with Canada to continue to expedite addition to reserve negotiations. Both these steps are important milestones to ensure the farm is returned to ecological balance and provides value for our growing membership.








Our client's TikTok channel, dedicated to sharing Douglas Treaty information, has been a resounding success, consistently attracting hundreds of views per video.


